## **THE FOUR LAST THINGS**

The Church ends the cycle of the Church Year, and the liturgical cycle, by reminding us of what is called "the four last things".

### **Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell**

Talking out these very real things each year is not the most enjoyable talk we can have about the God who loves and calls us to love. And God is love – that hasn't changed! The Church urges us to seriously consider the urgency of these realities before life ends.

This week we celebrate "Christ the King of The Universe"! Well, because that is what the end of time will show us without a doubt. God sent his son to reveal the reality of Himself (and the Trinity) to us and when time and space end for us in death – Jesus promises that we will be able to clearly know God. "We will see him as he is!"

Life is wonderful and death can be even more wonderful if we talk about the reality of who we are, where we come from, and where we are going. Jesus already gave us the answers to all these serious questions. *We are made out of God's love; we come from love and we are meant to return to that love for all eternity!* So, why do we live on Earth in human form? Jesus answered that too!

*To know, love and serve God and our neighbor.*

The fact that we are made as a society means that we are meant to help each other to return to God, not alone, but in the company of those we have loved. Each of our individual gifts and talents are built into us for the purpose of improving the lives of those around us. We come in to the world as individuals and leave in the company of Christ, by extending the love we contain to others.

That may sound simplistic but just try to live it out! Not everyone you meet is willing to receive your gifts of love. Some people are stuck in the mud of being alone. The gifts they have are squandered on selfish and destructive vices. This is where those who have heard the voice of Jesus, in the many ways The Church offers him, can reach out to those stuck in the mud of sinful living. Where charity works better than scorn and love works to heal rather than correct, Christians know the importance of the four last things.

Sure, each of us has the free will to make our own decisions in life. But, that is the beauty of working with love. Remember, "God is love", so when we use love we are working with the Holy Spirit and empowered by the strength of Jesus to draw one another to return to The Father (who is Love).

**Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell** lose their frightful reputation when we work with the Holy Spirit to change (*and help others to change*) our choices for vice into choices for virtue.

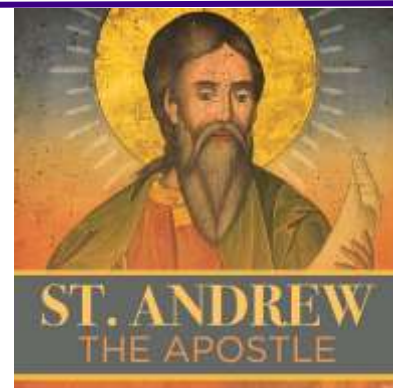

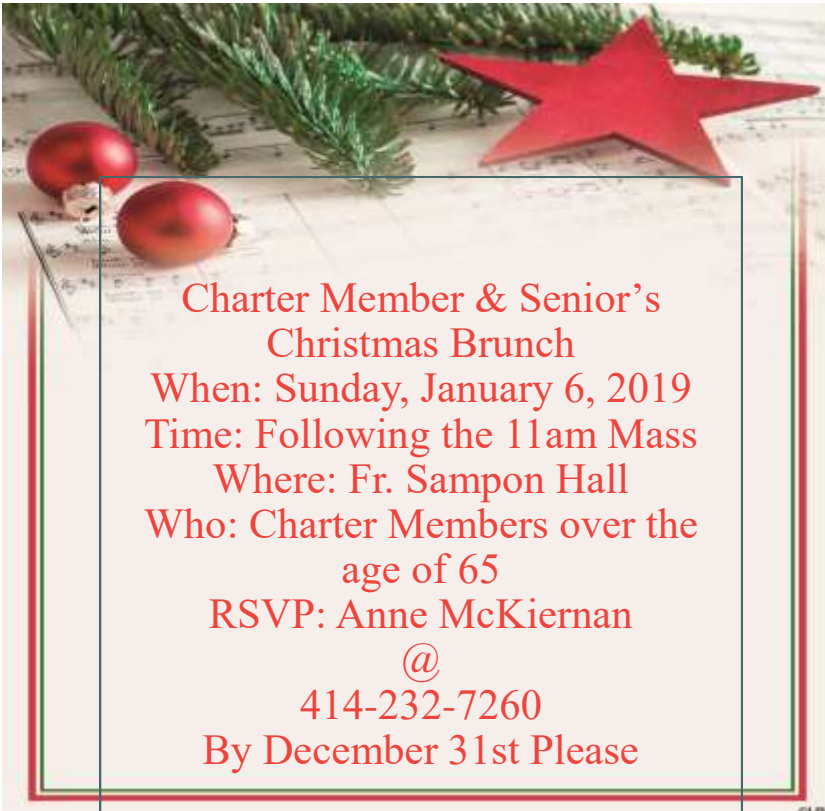
