From A Grateful Heart

"Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it.

*Some people God has designated in the church to be, **first, apostles; second, prophets; third, teachers**; then, mighty deeds; then gifts of healing, assistance, administration, and varieties of tongues.*

Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work mighty deeds? Do all have gifts of healing?

Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret?."

(1 Cor. 12:12-30)

Roles of those in the Church

St. Paul continues telling the first Christians in Corinth of God's Spirit. However, this time he addresses the administration of the Church as it widens and grows across the known world.

The work of Salvation is Christ's message – The Word of God" – Scripture!

The reality is that as the Word of God is spread it must be taught and understood with orthodoxy.

In other words, the same teachings of Jesus need to be communicated across different lands, cultures and ages while retaining the same meaning. The meaning Christ gave the Words he spoke to reveal God the Father and the Trinity to all ages.

THIS IS WHY JESUS ESTABLISH HIS CHURCH. (*Matt. 16:18*)

No one is to be lost or abandoned. The Salvation that Jesus brings is God's desire to unify all creation to himself. That means that no one person is tasked with special messages or knowledge. The knowledge of the Gospel's Message and the power of the sacraments all come from God in the Holy Spirit.

Even the interpretations of that message are protected by the Church (as a "Treasury of Faith") - the many Councils and Synods of Bishops whenever the leadership needs to clarify the faith!

This is what Paul is saying. Yes there are roles and duties of individuals - necessary – in the Church.

THAT DOESN'T MAKE ONE BETTER OR HIGHER THAN THE OTHER.

Paul compares the parts of the body to this problem of retaining Orthodoxy in the message of the Church's teaching in the faith.

No one part of the body is more exalted than another because of its duties it performs for the body.

Each part has a necessary function: Pope, Bishop, Priest, Deacon, Teacher, Lector, Usher, Office attendant, Treasurer, Accountant, Bookkeeper, Janitor.

Each of these roles is necessary for the functioning of the Church and not all for the same function. The faith is administered by the Bishops and taught by the priests and teachers. The roles of one don't make them better or more exalted than another!

Christ instructed the Apostles, and thus the Bishops, to first be Shepherds, willing to lay down their lives for the sheep under their care. (and they did!) Teachers are not priests. Priests are not Bishops. Office personal do not administer the sacraments and men are not women, children are not adults.


