From A Grateful Heart :

...They said to him:

“Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?” **(John 8:4-5)**

Then Jesus straightened up and said to her, “Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?” She replied, “No one, sir.” Then Jesus said, “Neither do I condemn you. Go and from now on do not sin anymore.” **(John 8:10-11)**

Jesus was concerned about the Teachers of the Faith in his time (the Pharisees & the Scribes). They claim to live the “Law of Moses”. Moses was God’s prophet and only taught what God commanded. As in verse 4 above – they are more concerned about the civil law to kill the woman than God’s Commandment #5- *Thou shall not kill*. Why didn’t they obey the 10 Commandments first?

We do this today, don’t we? We know what is taught by the Church (created by Christ to teach us of God’s Law of Love.). Yet we disobey Christ without as much as a thought of fear of God.

How can it be that our modern culture has strayed so far from God’s law of Love? Jesus did not condemn this woman and He doesn’t condemn us either. WE do that in disobedience to the Church and Christ’s commands. Lent is a time to return to the Lord with all your heart, all your strength, and all your soul! **(Deuteronomy 6:5)** – AND to teach others as well.

We must never grow tired of learning what God wants for us by reading Scripture and studying the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

St. Paul was a teacher of Christ Church, as he pleaded with the Romans- (Romans 12: 2,9-21)

“Do not conform yourselves to this age but, be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect [to Christ]. ...

“Let us never seek to condemn. We must seek to bless one another.

Let love be sincere; hate what is evil, hold on to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; anticipate one another in showing honor.

Do not grow slack in zeal, be fervent in spirit, and serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, endure in affliction, and persevere in prayer.

Contribute to the needs of the holy ones, exercise hospitality. Bless those who persecute [you], bless and do not curse them.

Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Have the same regard for one another; do not be haughty but associate with the lowly; do not be wise in your own estimation.

Do not repay anyone evil for evil; be concerned for what is noble in the sight of all.

If possible, on your part, live at peace with all. Beloved, do not look for revenge but leave room for the wrath; for it is written, “Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord.” Rather, “if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals upon his head.” Do not be conquered by evil but conquer evil with good.”
