6 Topics to Discuss with Your Siblings When Considering Senior Care Options

Health situations can change. I've seen many families take on the caregiving role out of love and an attempt to keep their parent in their home for as long as possible. But what starts off as a reasonable plan can turn into something else over time.

What's important is having a plan. But even more important is that it's meeting the needs of your loved one and those in the caregiving role. Consider putting care responsibilities into categories, with each sibling taking charge of things in his or her comfort zone.

Legal matters – Ensuring that your loved one's paperwork is in place. Is there an updated will, healthcare power of attorney, power of attorney over finances, and advance directives?

Financial matters – Are Mom and Dad having trouble managing the bills? What options does the family have to pay for long term care? Do your parents qualify for Veteran's benefits? Do they have long term care insurance? What are their income and assets... you'll need that specific information when considering long term care.

Medical issues and physician visits – Apart from making sure your parents get the care they need, this is an opportunity to have an open conversation with your parent's doctors about their overall health and what supportive services are available if needed.

Their house – Though your loved one may want to stay in their home, can they manage caring for it?

Social needs – Does dad need a ride to church? Should transportation to the monthly women's club be part of the task list? Though you are at mom's house accomplishing tasks, it isn't the same as spending quality time with her.

Exploring future care options - Homecare vs. assisted living – There is an important role for in-home care in the range of senior services. It can work well when a parent has a care need that follows a consistent schedule. But one of the challenges of relying on in-home care is that needs do not always arise when a caregiver is in the home.

If you have not explored what assisted living looks like today, you're missing an important option. Knowledge is empowering!

5th Sunday of Easter

"I give you a new commandment: love one another." With these words, Jesus sums up the law and the prophets in one concise phrase. Love one another. After 2,000 years, you'd think we'd have it figured out by now! But all too often we fail in this commandment. Perhaps we mistake "love" for mere "common decency." Perhaps we've been betrayed, or our own visions of love have been tarnished or misrepresented in our lives. Blessedly, Jesus doesn't leave us without a guide.

"As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." Jesus himself modeled what this love should look like. So what are some of the characteristics of the love of Christ? Humility, for one. St. Paul writes that Jesus "emptied Himself." In becoming man, Jesus puts aside the full splendor of the Godhead. Not only does he become human, but he takes on many of the mundane privations of human life. He spent most of his life in relative poverty - especially by our standards - as a common laborer. When he began gaining popularity as a preacher, he still traveled on foot and spent nights in other people's homes or outdoors.

Jesus' love is generous. He was always available to the crowds and to being interrupted by people in need. He invested time in his disciples and patiently taught them about the kingdom of God. The love of Jesus is also courageous. He encountered many people deemed less worthy of human respect, due to being public sinners or having a physical or mental disability. Jesus was brave in breaking these social boundaries to show care and concern to the outcast. These traits are possible for us to imitate! Indeed, we are hardly identifiable as Christians without them. "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." FROM LPI PUBLICATIONS
