

From A Grateful Heart

“Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; yet the word you hear is not mine but that of the Father who sent me.

"I have told you this while I am with you.

The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you.” (*John 14:23-27a*)

The Command to Keep the Words of Jesus

Jesus makes the words he speaks equal to belief in him and not only him but, God - The Father!

As I have often preached, the WORD of God is not letters on a page. Jesus is the WORD of the Father and the Word of God – given for our benefit, our Salvation.

This “word” is a living person – Jesus Christ! Friendship with God and a relationship with heaven depend on a personal encounter with the person of Jesus Christ. Jesus makes this as clear as possible in this section of St. John’s Gospel.

However, God is a Trinity and a relationship with God is a relationship with the Trinity – ONE GOD!

Jesus founded The Church on a “rock” foundation (Simon). As any good builder knows, a solid foundation is necessary for any institution to last. Jesus founded a Church as a lasting institution to continue the work he commissioned to the Apostles. Since human beings are mortal and last - but a life time – Jesus founded a Church that would last for every generation by giving human authority to Peter and his successors with the protection of “an advocate”, The Holy Spirit.

So, the WORD that Jesus gave to the Apostles hear is the same word you and I hear today. However, since those words only have meaning in the context of God revealing himself to us, the message is known to us through the very institution of Jesus Christ had founded = The Church. And the meaning restored, from centuries of lost cultural language, is made understandable in the presence of the Advocate sent by Jesus Christ = The Holy Spirit!

Deacon Paul Wilkin grew up in Cincinnati, Ohio within a Catholic family of eight children separated by 14 years, he is #7 of 8. He has an inclination for geography and art. In his youth he played baseball, in high school he ran track, played in the band was on city youth/adult soccer teams for years. He has earned an associate's degree in commercial art before returning to college for night classes to earn his bachelor's degree in graphic design.

Paul lived in the British Virgin Islands for a year then on rural Vashon Island near Seattle, WA for 18 years which is accessible only by ferry boat. Before the Salvatorians, Paul was the owner and graphic designer of a sole proprietorship full-service marketing and design firm – Gargoyle Design – for 17 years. His hobbies include: photography, motorcycle touring, woodworking, gardening, genealogy and preference for old time radio programs, movies and TV shows.

Paul rediscovered his faith when Fr. Richard R. Roach SCJ, retired Marquette Theology scholar, gave "homi-lectures" at mass in the small rural Vashon Island, WA church. The spark towards a religious life calling came one night while he was researching companies in which to submit his resume (edited version, unedited version ask Paul). After four years of varied discernment the Salvatorians were appealing because of their international presence and as Paul said, "With my diversity of being a jack-of-all-trades" I'm drawn to the Salvatorian words 'by all ways and means.' "

Paul joined the Salvatorians in 2013 to discern his calling as a Priests or as a Brother. Called to priesthood, the Salvatorian formation process would take seven years from Candidature, Novitiate, First/Temporary profession, Final profession, Transitional Diaconate through Ordination to the Priesthood. Paul has had diverse ministries both locally as well as three summers in Vietnam and a year in Manila, Philippines studying Theology with other Salvatorian seminarians. He has one more semester of seminary after Ordination and feels called to be a Salvatorian Apostle and to minister in Vietnam or Asia.


