From A Grateful Heart

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you."
 Jesus said to him, "**Feed my lambs.**"
 He then said to Simon Peter a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?"
 Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you."
 Jesus said to him, "**Tend my sheep.**"
 Jesus said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?"
 Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you."
 Jesus said to him, "**Feed my sheep**". (John 21:15-17)

The Command of Jesus to Simon (Peter) "Feed my Lambs, Tend my Sheep, Feed my Sheep"

This weekend we will hear Jesus evoke a confession and repentance from Simon Peter for having denied Him three times. Peter is comfortable after having been fed by the Lord and aware of his denial and oath of loyalty that he gave Jesus before the crucifixion. Now Peter basks in the mercy of Jesus, who holds no grudge or requites an apology from Peter.

The questions from Jesus are a surprise from Peter. Is Peter guilty of presuming Christ's forgiveness for Peter's apostasy (Yes, Peter denied God and lost the faith for a time)?

Apostasy is the act of excommunication one commits against the Church. It is a denial of Jesus Christ as God and the Church as his presence on Earth.

[According to Wikipedia: "The term apostasy comes from the Greek word *apostasia* ("ἀποστασία"), meaning defection, departure, revolt or rebellion. It has been described as "a willful falling away from, or rebellion against, Christianity. Apostasy is the rejection of Christ by one who has been a Christian..." Apostasy is a theological category describing those who have voluntarily and consciously abandoned their faith in the God of the covenant, who manifests himself most completely in Jesus Christ."]]

We could compare Peter's denial to an act of doubt or fear. The martyrs refused to deny Christ and were killed for their stubbornness. Peter ran away and cried. However, we know that later he accepted crucifixion to confess Christ's divinity. Since we have just celebrated Christ Mercy in "Mercy Sunday", I was thinking about The Mercy of God as taught by Christ in this Sunday's Gospel.

As followers of Christ [as Christians] we ought to imitate the Master (Jesus). The acts of Peter and Judas are very different. Peter defended Jesus but doubted. Judas acted for Jesus to direct the mission of Salvation into a Holy War that became a betrayal. (Judas had anticipated that *The Messiah would lead a "Holy War" from heaven, prophesied in the scriptures, against the Romans and Jesus was to be the leader of this Holy War. Judas' apostasy came when he tried to direct the path of that Salvation by getting Jesus to confront and go to war with his advisories, the Jewish Leaders and the Romans.*)

When we anticipate and falsely interpret the Word of God in Scripture, we too betray Jesus and commit the sin of apostasy as well. Jesus gave us the Church with Peter as its Shepherd to Feed and Tend the people of God. Jesus sent The Holy Spirit as our Advocate in the Church as the one true interpreter of God's revelation in time. If we anticipate the meaning of God in the scriptures without listening to the teachings of the Church – we commit a sin against Jesus. In essence we commit apostasy against the divine nature and purpose of Christ in the work of Salvation. Obedience to the Church is obedience to Christ!




