From A Grateful Heart ~

For the sake of the joy that laid before him Jesus endured the cross, despising its shame, and has taken his seat on the throne of God. Consider how he endured such opposition from sinners and did not grow weary and lose heart. In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding blood." *(Hebrews 12:2-4)*

To Obey Christ's Command to Love is to Endure Rebuke!

This Sunday is the 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Jesus teaches the disciples that if they live in the truth he gives them, the world will oppose them with force and death.

*"Jesus said to his disciples:
"I have come to set the earth on fire,
and how I wish it were already blazing!...
Do you think that I have come to establish
peace on the earth?
No, I tell you, but rather division".*

Last week the US Bishops responded to the violent killings in El Paso, saying: "The tragic loss of life of 22 people in El Paso demonstrates that hate-filled rhetoric and ideas can become the motivation for some to commit acts of violence. The anti-immigrant, anti-refugee, anti-Muslim, and anti-Semitic sentiments that have been publicly proclaimed in our society in recent years have incited hatred in our communities" [as evidenced in the motivation of the shooters who killed **11 people** in the Synagogue in Pittsburgh, the **9 people** killed at Mother Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, the **26 people** killed at The First Baptist Church in Sutherland Springs, Texas.] "We, therefore, renew our call to all to act swiftly to stop using hate-filled language that demeans and divides us and motivates some to such horrific violence. Instead, we ask our leaders and all Americans to work to unite us as a great, diverse, and welcoming people."

Over the past five years 371 people have been killed by gunmen who were American citizens with hateful intentions. Several priests have been attacked and killed as a response to their priestly ministry. Many of these killings were attacks on people of faith at prayer.

The world will oppose living a life of love and calling for justice, and end to oppression of the poor, the killing of the unborn, the hate against refugees and the end to human trafficking. All of these evils deny the God given right to life and the respect owe to each human being, made in the "image and likeness of God". Jesus commanded that we love one another and oppose evil where it lives.

To love good is to oppose evil! To serve God and follow as disciples of Jesus is to speak the truth of the Gospel, work for justice and peace, to assist the poor and shelter the less fortunate.

St. Paul said to the Romans: *"Let us then pursue what leads to peace by building up one another."*

Fr. Alejandro (Alex) Rodriguez, s.x. of the St. Francis Xavier Missionaries, will be preaching the Mission Appeal **August 31 & September 1 here at St. Margaret Mary** as part of the annual Missionary Cooperation Plan.

Fr. Alex, born in Mexico, is a graduate of Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, and was ordained in Guadalajara, Mexico. He has served as a missionary in The Philippines. He has worked as the Vocation Director, Vicar, at Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in a poverty-stricken area of metro Manila, Spiritual Director at the St. Faustina Catholic School, Collaborator with the campus ministry of different universities in the Philippines, and Rector of the Philosophy Seminary of the Xaverians in the Philippines. Fr. Alex is presently working in the field of Vocations and the Hispanic Ministry in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, as well as being the Rector at our mission center in Franklin, WI. He is willing to share his mission experience with anyone interested.

Being exclusively a foreign mission society, the Xaverian Fathers and Brothers depend greatly on proceeds from this collection. They carry out their service in Bangladesh, Brazil, Burundi, Cameroon, Chad, Columbia, the Democratic Republic of Congo (formerly Zaire), France, Great Britain, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Mozambique, the Philippines, Sierra Leone, Spain, Taiwan, and the United States.
