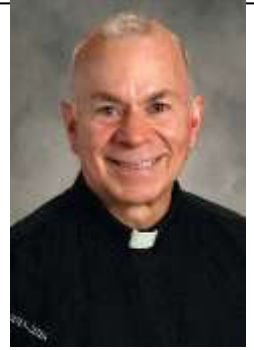

The Communion Of Saints!

We Believe in a “Communion of Saints”, The “Resurrection from the Dead” and “Life Everlasting”. AMEN!! To that I want to stop and say: “REALLY!!!”

That is a lot to say and realize for in the moment, can anyone really say that and believe it?

1. To share all things in common is to – “Live in Communion”.
2. To believe in the basis of our faith (That Christ was born, died and rose from the Dead) is to profess a belief that we too will - “Rise from The Dead”
3. To live forever – is believe in Heaven and Eternal Life therein.

When we “profess” these truths at Mass I would think that honesty would compel us to rush home and look these matters up. The Catechism of The Catholic Church [Section 2 – The Creeds]

#960 - *The Church is a "communion of saints": this expression refers first to the "holy things" (sancta), above all the Eucharist, by which "the unity of believers, who form one body in Christ, is both represented and brought about" (LG 3).*

#961 - *The term "communion of saints" refers also to the communion of "holy persons" (sancti) in Christ who "died for all," so that what each one does or suffers in and for Christ bears fruit for all.*

#962 - *"We believe in the communion of all the faithful of Christ, those who are pilgrims on earth, the dead who are being purified, and the blessed in heaven, all together forming one Church; and we believe that in this communion, the merciful love of God and his saints is always [attentive] to our prayers" (Paul VI, CPG # 30).*

We are all called to be saints. That is what a life “in Communion” would mean. We act as one body, as the Body of Christ – The Church! All parts are important and necessary. All members are loved. All Love is from God. The saints and martyrs get their strength to love greatly but uniting with Christ’s great love for us. The life we live today is temporary and our soul (soon to be joined by our “new” body, in the Resurrection) will have us live forever. If we hold on to Christ and love as he does – we die to rise as saints. If we live with reservation of some human vices – we rise in Purgatory. Though assured of a heavenly reward, we are purged of the vices that keep us from the purity our soul must possess to enter heaven.

Either way we belong to The Church, as members of Christ’s Body. A Communion of saints:

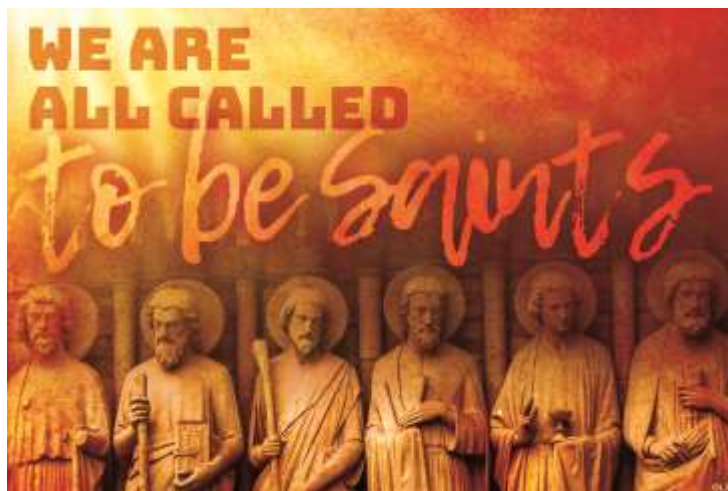
The Church Suffering – in Purgatory

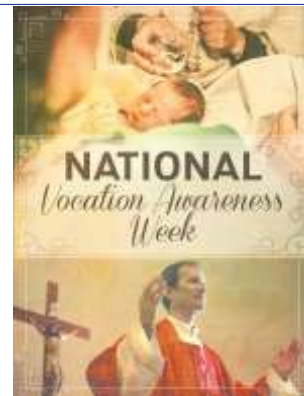
