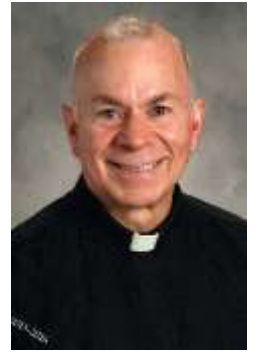

From A Grateful Heart

A scholar of the law tested Jesus by asking him,
 "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?"
 He responded,
**"You shall love the Lord, your God,
 with all your heart,
 with all your soul,
 and with all your mind.**
 This is the greatest and the first commandment.
 The second is like it:
You shall love your neighbor as yourself.
 The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."
 (Mt. 22:35-40)

Jesus Warns: Love is the Law!

Jesus quotes from the Book of Deuteronomy that famous Creed of the Jewish believer: Deuteronomy 6:4-5. It is written usually found on a small tablet and placed at the entrance door post of a Jewish home.

Our Creed contains the knowledge of The Trinity and the role of each person in Salvation History. However, the quote from Jesus is not only from the mouth of God the Father but, a revelation from himself to Moses. Since, Jesus is God and the author of the "Shmah or Shema Yisrael" (Jewish Creed, in Hebrew) he has the right to amend or improve on his words to Moses. This "improving word" of Jesus is called the Principal of Supersedence. This is where one rule is replaced by another updated rule of the same functioning.

Jesus reminds the Pharisees that the Sabbath was made for Man and that God is the "Lord of the Sabbath" not man. What he means is that the purpose God gives to what he has made belongs to him. The Jewish priests have no authority over re-defining the purpose of what God has made.

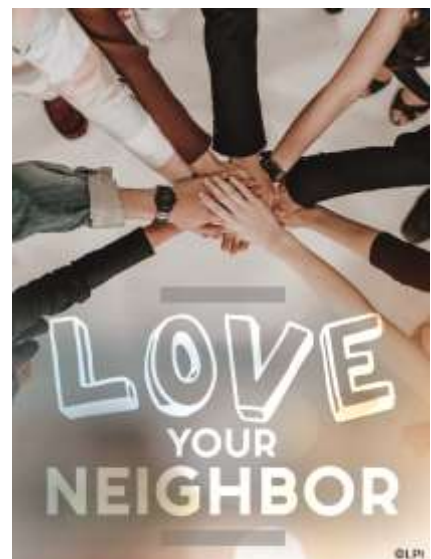
We see this often in the New Testament. I suggest that this is primary and the reason it is a NEW Testament of God. Just as the Second Vatican Council (Vatican II) was not new but a supersedence of earlier teachings that improved our "modern understanding" of long held principals of The Church of Jesus Christ. No changes were made to what God had made in forming the Church! The Church IS CHRIST and that can never be changed, only better understood.

In this way supersedence is how Jesus creates the Church on Earth through his Resurrection and teachings that reveal a God more intimately involved in our lives.

God is Love/ the Law of Moses was corrupted by the believers in Jesus time. So, God re-established his Church and the promise of Salvation not under a "Law" as Torah. God established his Church anew under the command of Love, because God is Love.

"I give you a new command: That you Love one another!" (John 13:34)
