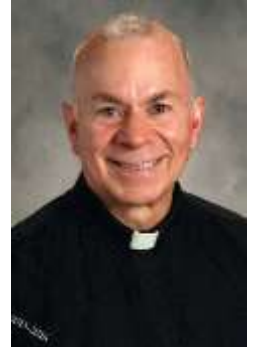

We are always courageous,

(2 Corinthians 5:6-8)*



WE WALK BY FAITH – WHERE DOES FAITH COME FROM?

In this Sunday’s reading we hear the teachings of Jesus to how to live.

In Ordinary Time, the Church gives us much to contemplate. Who are we, from where did we come, and how to live “a good” and holy life. St. Paul tells the Christians of Corinth to “walk by faith and not by sight.” Faith is how we see from God sight is from is how we see from Earth.

The experience of a graduated 8th grader in his/her first days of high school learns that they are in a different culture. They need to learn the “unspoken rules” or how to get along with this new group of self-conscience teenagers. It is very uncomfortable and a world where adults are shunned – since they can’t understand and just “don’t get it”.

Walking by faith is like entering high school and trying to find your way around. It can’t be done well alone, you need a “posse” – I mean, friends. This is one of the geniuses of religion – we walk together through the many mysteries of the world Jesus presents.

That world is a world where God is the source of everything. He really is in all worlds but, the reality of it comes out with great challenges in the experiences of living the faith of Jesus Christ. We walk by faith. Faith then, is a gift of grace from God to accompany us through the world with its many challenges. The devil wants us to ignore faith and to “walk by sight”. As if whatever we experience can be understood in our own unique way. That means what we believe is relative to me and by me alone. It is as I see it! This is called: “Relativism”. The logic goes like this: I judge what I see and I decide what it is. Nobody else can tell me what to think.

Walking by our own sight in trying to understand God is impossible....

*Jesus looked at them and said, “For mortals **it is impossible**, but for God all things are possible.”
(Matthew 19:26 and Mark 10:27)*

The gift of FAITH gives us eyes to see the mysteries of eternity, as Jesus presents the Kingdom of God we find is like entering high school. A strange new world with realities that look do-able but, can only be done with help from Jesus. This is way FAITH is a sort of surrender. We surrender our will to God’s will and are then able to understand the world beyond what we see. We can experience the eternity in which God calls us. Our true home, away from home! Heaven is our origin and our destiny attainable only by surrendering our will (of selfishness) to the will of God (love of all).

This new way of walking is not foreign to us – it is our true nature, given to us at Baptism. We are part of the ‘Body of Christ’ and can only navigate this new world with the help of a Savior and his Church.

The by-laws of our parish corporation require that a trustee-secretary and a trustee-treasurer be elected by the parish membership in alternating years to two-year terms. Due to the pandemic last year, we were not able to conduct elections. Nancy Bonesho, our current trustee-treasurer has agreed to stay on for an additional year. Cheryl Vosswinkel has been nominated by Fr. Pat to the position of trustee-secretary.

Trustees must be parish members, practicing Catholics and at least 25 years old. They are ex-officio members of the Pastoral Council and participate fully in the work of the Council. They are also two of the five officers of the parish corporation. (The archbishop is president; the pastor is vice-president and an auxiliary bishop is the other member.)

If you would like to self-nominate, or you would like to nominate someone else to run for trustee-secretary, you are invited to submit nomination papers to the parish office by 12 noon on June 21, 2021. A nomination requires the signature of 10 parish members. Nomination papers are available online from the parish website, in the back of the church or from the parish office.
