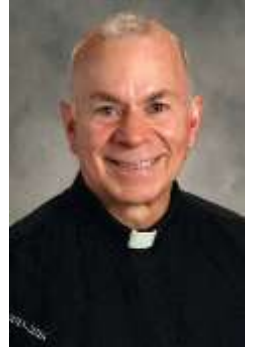

From A Grateful Heart

BELIEVE IN THE TRUE PRESENCE OF CHRIST!

The Feast of Corpus Christi was promulgated by Pope John XXII in 1317, after confirming the reality of the Eucharistic Miracle at Orvieto, Italy.

Over 100 Eucharistic Miracles left physical evidence around the world of the true presence of Jesus in the Consecrated host. One of the most incredible was the Miracle of Lanciano at Orvieto 1263 in Italy.

In 1263, a priest by the name of Petrus in Lanciano, Italy was experiencing doubts about the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. In the middle of saying Mass, he said the words of consecration ("This is my body," "This is my blood) and saw the bread and wine transform into real human flesh and blood. The blood coagulated into five globules (later believed to be representative of the five wounds of Christ). Word of the miracle quickly spread, the local archbishop launched an investigation, and the Church approved the miracle.

The flesh is still preserved to this day. In 1981, Professor Odoardo Linoli, Professor of Anatomy and Pathological and Chemistry and Clinical Microscopy conducted a scientific analysis of the flesh in 1971 and concluded that the flesh was cardiac tissue, the blood appeared to be fresh blood (as opposed to blood that was 1200 years old), and there was no trace of preservatives. The corporal remains on display in the Cathedral of Orvieto. (I personally saw this cloth in my trip to Italy in 2015.)

God, who made and is above all things, created all things.... How? With His WORD!

God's WORD is not just letters or speech, but the creative action of God. We hear in John's Gospel, In the beginning was God's Word... and The Word became flesh and dwelt among us.

Christ commands that we are to eat his body and drink his blood.

Not just believe in him but to unite with him, participate in relationship with him and to become one with Him. Christ desires to bring God into the world through our cooperation with His Gospel message. That is what a Christian is and does. Not as a group, closed to others. But as a life-style that centers around a unity of purpose that all people might be saved in the knowledge of his love.

Jesus Christ is a creative, redemptive force that can only save us if we "Commune" with him. That is where we get the word "Communion". We commune with God in the Eucharist. The world is saved in the community of Christ's body and blood – Corpus Christi!

As Augustine (Bishop of Hippo) once said to those receiving Eucharist for the first time.
"See Jesus here: Receive what you are and become what you receive"!

The by-laws of our parish corporation require that a trustee-secretary and a trustee-treasurer be elected by the parish membership in alternating years to two-year terms. Due to the pandemic last year, we were not able to conduct elections. Nancy Bonesho, our current trustee-treasurer has agreed to stay on for an additional year. Cheryl Vosswinkel has been nominated by Fr. Pat to the position of trustee-secretary.

Trustees must be parish members, practicing Catholics and at least 25 years old. They are ex-officio members of the Pastoral Council and participate fully in the work of the Council. They are also two of the five officers of the parish corporation. (The archbishop is president; the pastor is vice-president and an auxiliary bishop is the other member.)

A nomination requires the signature of 10 parish members. Nomination papers are available online from the parish website, in the back of the church or from the parish office.
