


*From A Grateful Heart*

***DOES GOD WORK MIRACLES TODAY?***

We know that the nature of God is to heal and love. The working of miracles is for the love of us who lack faith. So, why aren't there more of them in this age of nihilism and secularism?

I guess the best answer is if you don't want to see something you close your eyes or deny what is going on around you. Some may say that every time they wake up in the morning it is a miracle that life continues. However, we Catholics believe in miracles that happen every day – **The Eucharist!**

This miracle happens because Jesus made it a “perpetual institution” and an eternal reality for the Church he created, beginning with Peter and the other 11 Apostles. (see: *Matthew 26:26, Mark 14:22, Luke 22:19, 1 Corinthians 11:24*)

Pope Francis beatified a 14-year-old boy who died of leukemia but spent most of his life cataloguing the many Eucharistic Miracles into a website to evangelize the doubters. 
The bread and wine become changed into the true presence of Jesus Body & Blood. Not because the Church say so , but because Jesus (God) said so in the scripture quotations listed above.

However, other miracles happen all the time but are not as dramatic as eucharistic miracles. They are the birth and conception of a child (not always predicable, ask any parent!) The forgiveness offered unexpectedly by one who was offended by another. The love another given unconditionally. The growth of a garden can be a miracle, at times. The narrow escape from a traffic accident that didn't happen at the last second. The forgiveness of God in the confessional for things we would never forgive each other. The extraordinary gift of generosity from one who has very little to give and yet never goes wanting. These little daily miracles keep us guessing.

We are made in the image and likeness of our God who IS the very source of love and forgiveness. Truth and peace are natural parts of our making by Our Benevolent God. *“Love One Another!”* The miracle is giving in to love and letting go of pride, control and self-righteousness.

We can't be what God made - if we try to be God in the making. ***Think about it?!***
