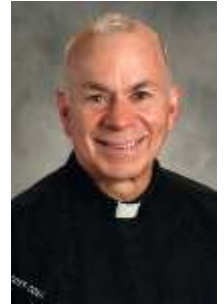

*He said to them,
 "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave.
 Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you,
 leave and shake the dust off your feet against them."
 So, they went off and preached repentance.
 The Twelve drove out many demons also, and
 they anointed many who were sick, with oil, and cured them.
 (Ephesus 1:10-13)*



*Is anyone among you suffering? He should pray. Is anyone in good spirits? He should sing praise.
 Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the priests of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up and if he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven.*

(James 5:13-15)

Where Does the Sacrament of the Sick come from in Scripture?

What does it mean to be "sick" and to then be "cured?"

The word in Latin is *et aegros* – which does mean "ill" or "anxious or worry". A spiritual hurt.
 In the Prayer after the "Our Father" the priest says: "Deliver us Lord, from every evil and grant us peace in our day. In your mercy keep us free from sin and protect us from all anxiety."

The peace of Christ is compared to anxiety or a sickness of the soul! The Sacrament of the Sick is truly a healing given by God through the same vehicle he provides us His mercy and grace. God provides healing of the soul to heal the body in turn. Just as grace and mercy are given to us by way of the soul. They affect the person body and soul – or should I say soul and body – since the soul receives God's assistance first and then shares it with the body. They work together body & soul!

The Sacrament of the Sick can relieve the anxiety of life that makes us "soul sick." We might say that our spirit is sad or not well, but this would be to misunderstand the spirit is a sharing of the divine life as we share that unifying essence with the angels, God and each other. To be "One in the Spirit" is to recognize the divine life in each of us. We share that spirit with everyone that God has made and with all the baptized in a special way.

"We are made in the image and likeness of God." (Genesis 1:26)

So, God truly is the first source of healing since He is the source of LIFE. The power of healing can come through to us in many ways: The Sacraments of Healing –

- The Sacrament of the Sick
- The Sacrament of Reconciliation
- The Sacrament of Baptism
- The Sacrament of the Eucharist
- Forgiveness of neighbor
- Mercy of kindness
- Love given to a Stranger
- The prayer of intercession to God for another
- A random act of unexpected kindness
