

PONDERINGS OF THE HEART

*"As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."
~Joshua 24:15*

That is quite the declaration that Joshua makes. Serving the Lord is an act of faith. It is committing to more that is unknown than known, and trusting in God's goodness at every step, especially those that challenge or confuse us.

When I consider what it means to serve the Lord, I am reminded of the pericope in Matthew: "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be" (Mt. 6:21). At first blush, this creates a warm and fuzzy feeling. Surely the Lord is my treasure, and how fortunate I am for this blessing! The cozy feeling, however, dissipated, when I encountered someone who challenged me to consider "treasure" not as God, but as the gifts God has bestowed on me. They asked me to look at how I steward those gifts and reflect on whether someone else would know that God is my treasure based on where I focus my time, my talents, and my monies. Ouch! That was a wakeup call.

This realization forced me to get honest with myself about who I serve. I started by asking myself what a stranger might say about who I serve if they had to guess based only on how I spent my time, talents, and monies. Frankly, I was ashamed by what I saw. I realized that I was really serving myself. If my heart is where my treasure is, then my heart was disproportionately focused on serving me. The vast majority of things in my life revolved around doing things I enjoyed, sharing my talents for income or recognition, and spending to ensure comfort, pleasure, and prestige. It's not that it is wrong to make provision for enjoyment, but for me, it was out of whack. Outside of Sunday Mass, no one would realize that my treasure is the Lord and my commitment is to serve.

Rather than concede this moment as a litany of failures, I encountered it, and continue to, daily, as an opportunity. I realize that to say I serve the Lord is a covenant that requires active participation. It challenges me to be vigilant with how I spend my time, use my talents, and direct my monies. And, unexpectedly, I have learned that serving the Lord in these ways, which always means serving others, creates that warm fuzzy feeling that feeds me, too. ~Jacque
