## **Getting to Know You**

We are sharing a little “Q&A” segment with staff to help us all become better acquainted and encourage you to reach out and let us know how we can best serve the community.



### **How long have you worked at STMMS?**

My assignment at St. Margaret Mary began on July 1, 2018. In anticipation of my move to Milwaukee, however, I arrived earlier in May to prepare the Rectory (which had been Wauwatosa Day Care from January 1998 to 2015) as my new living quarters. The rectory has 5,200 square feet of space. That took a lot of planning since it needed cleaning, appliances, painting, new carpet, large rugs (5 – 6ft x 4ft.), furniture, plus the entire yard and fencing needed to be replaced and upgraded. So I moved in and asked Fr. Reed to share the space with me since he would be Pastor at MGC soon.

### **What are some of the challenges about your work?**

The challenges at STMMP have been updating the worship space and the campus grounds. I had to hire staff and a school principal, twice. Getting to know my parishioners has been a challenge for two reasons: one, I am terrible at remembering names and two, we have a lot of visitors from other parishes that enjoy praying with us.

### **What do you do for fun?**

For fun I enjoy biking, weight lifting, gardening, time with my 12-yr. old black Labrador retriever (Joseph) and outings with friends and parishioners.

### **What is your favorite season, and why?**

Fall is my favorite season because of the colors, and it not too hot and it is not too cold, it is just right!

### **What is your favorite food/drink? Favorite place/brand?**

Favorites on my list of foods are whole wheat spaghetti and meatballs, baked fish with steamed vegetables, banana bread with nuts and dark chocolate anything! All that could be washed down with milk, iced tea or a cold beer. The best way to drink beer is while watching the Packers play (or, rather, WIN!).

### **What is the best way to get in touch?**

I will answer texts or emails. My cell number is in the bulletin and I particularly enjoy theological questions and an exchange of ideas. “You grow on what you don’t know.”

### **Favorite quote / life motto?**

If I were to have a motto, it might be:

(Psalm 25:4) “Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths.”

### **What else should we know about you?**

I entered The Salvatorians in 2001, took vows in 2003, and was ordained in 2009 (the year of the priest). Before that I finished my college degree 20 years after having left Loras College, in 1993. I went on to get a master’s degree in economics (MA, in 1995) at UWM - Milwaukee. In seminary I earned a master’s degree in divinity (MDiv.).

I have had a wide range of job experiences: an Orderly in a nursing home, a hospital supply dept. manager, a cab driver, a metal works factory worker, and shoe store manager and planner, a bank bookkeeper, a bank department manager of records and research, and a weight training coach.

## SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

In two weeks, October 30/31, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing after all liturgies.

*Anointing of the Sick I:  
The Mystery of Illness*



We get hurt. We wear out. The lungs, the eyes, the memory, and any of the many limbs and organs that compose us break or ache. Gloom comes over us then: pity for ourselves, sorrow, depression, anger. But hope can come, too, and courage, and sometimes peace.

All of this is marked and celebrated in the rites of our tradition. With a word and a deed, with touch and breath and spit and mud, Jesus heals those who ail. In every place and time, we who are the church remember and tell stories of healing, anoint the sick with oil and share the one bread, even with those who cannot assemble for Mass. Thus the sick and the healthy, the homebound and the spry, saints and sinners are made one and remain one, a single body of many parts.

Anyone who is seriously ill can be anointed, including the elderly who become weaker, even if no illness is present; those waiting for surgery when a serious condition is the reason for the operation; sick children who have sufficient use of reason to be helped by the celebration; and those who are unconscious or who have lost the use of reason, provided that they probably would have asked for the sacrament had they the use of their faculties. Furthermore, many forms of mental illness are now known to be serious. So the mentally ill may be anointed, provided that they will be helped and not harmed by the rite. If you have questions, consult a priest or other parish leader.

The most complete celebration of the sacrament is a communal one, a celebration in which those to be anointed are surrounded and supported by other members of the Christian community, whether at home, or in the house of the church (for those who can leave their beds and come here). In song and in silence, with scriptures and prayers, we strengthen the bonds of love and faith that are stronger than the most lethal disease and more powerful even than death.
